### BACKGROUND

The 3rd Congressional District of Louisiana is home to one of the most significant number of PESA Member employers in the country. Well over 2,000 PESA Member employees live and work in all areas of the 3rd Congressional District. Many of these men and woman provide services to the offshore industry as well as significant onshore drilling operations.

In 1947, the first offshore U.S. commercial crude oil well that was out of sight of land was completed 10 miles off the Louisiana coast. Although the water was only 18 feet deep, the well was a significant achievement in opening the Gulf of Mexico to crude oil production. The Gulf has become one of the largest U.S. crude oil-producing regions and holds high oil reserves. Many of the nation's largest oil fields are found off the Louisiana coast in the federal Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) waters, and a large share of federal OCS production in the Gulf of Mexico comes onshore in Louisiana


### QUICK FACTS

- Louisiana ranks among the top 10 states in both crude oil reserves and annual crude oil production
- Louisiana is one of the top five natural gas-producing states in the country. The state accounts for about 6% of U.S. marketed gas production, and holds about 5% of the nation's proved dry natural gas reserves
- In early 2016, the first large-scale LNG export terminal in the Lower 48 states opened at Sabine Pass and will be able to process 3.5 billion cubic feet of gas per day for export when fully operational.
- Louisiana is home to two of the four storage sites that make up the U.S. Strategic Petroleum Reserve, which is capable of holding an emergency stockpile of 727 million barrels of oil. The two Louisiana sites can hold up to almost 300 million barrels.
