BACKGROUND

For nearly 120 years, oil and gas has been produced in the Sooner State. In Oklahoma, 1 in 5 jobs is directly or indirectly supported by the oil and gas industry. The industry paid \$2 billion in direct taxes in fiscal year 2015. PESA member companies directly employ more than 700 individuals in Oklahoma District 1 with high paying manufacturing and technical jobs.

- Excluding federal offshore areas, Oklahoma was the nation's fifth-largest crude oil producing state in 2016.
- Oklahoma is one of the top natural-gas producing states in the nation, accounting for 7.6 percent of U.S. gross production and 8.7 percent of marketed production in 2016.
- The Oklahoma oil and gas industry supports 114,762 full and part-time jobs and \$20.4 billion in gross state product with an average salary of \$94,000 per year.
