

# Oilfield Services and Equipment in **OKLAHOMA**

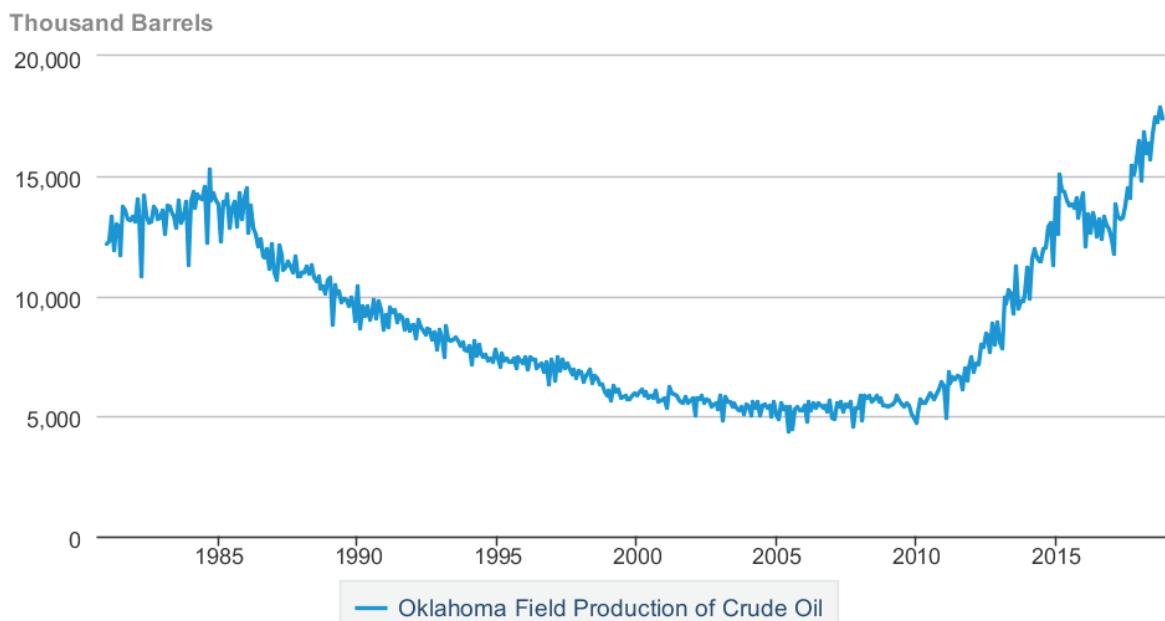
## BACKGROUND

For nearly 120 years, oil and gas has been produced in the Sooner State. In Oklahoma, one in five jobs is directly or indirectly supported by the oil and gas industry. The industry paid \$2 billion in direct taxes in fiscal year 2015. PESA Member Companies directly employ more than 3,700 individuals in Oklahoma with high-paying manufacturing and technical jobs.

## QUICK FACTS

- Excluding federal offshore areas, Oklahoma was the nation's fifth-largest crude oil producing state in 2016.
- Oklahoma is one of the top natural-gas producing states in the nation, accounting for 7.6% of U.S. gross production and 8.7% of marketed production in 2016.
- The Oklahoma oil and gas industry supports 114,762 full and part-time jobs and \$20.4 billion in gross state product with an average salary of \$94,000 per year.
